

Speaker 1: I don't want to make an elevated blood pressure. Let's just leave it at that.

Speaker 2: Your Honor, I'm being...

Speaker 1: Hold on, sir.

Speaker 2: Hold on, hold on. One second.

Speaker 1: We're back on the record, F.D. 031946-22, Lisa M. Lisa F. Lacks versus Glenn H. Hahn. Mr. Hahn, I'm going to continue this due to the medical emergency that you're undergoing. The TRO remains in full force and effect, and we will be in touch with you when you tell me when you're better to come back here and continue the trial, okay? I do have your doctor's note. Next time you come in, if you need to put your feet up, let's do it in a wheelchair so you don't have to do it on the desk. If your doctor can make reference to elevated feet, I'd like to be in a wheelchair, not on the table. It's just not appropriate.

Speaker 2: I understand that, Your Honor. I'd like to make a statement to that as well.

Speaker 0: And, Your Honor, if we could just... Just because they're pointed in my address, if we could just put socks on...

Speaker 1: Yeah, yeah. Just so in the future, I know, sir, I know you have problems, so I'm going to accommodate you, but just let's do it in a wheelchair with something that we don't have to see.

Speaker 2: I also want you to know especially that these particular issues were a result of physical abuse by Mrs. Flacks to myself.

Speaker 1: Okay, so we're going to continue with the trial. Okay, Your Honor. Okay, when you let us know how the status is of your medical...

Speaker 2: Fine, Your Honor. There's a problem here. Mrs. Flacks continues to take away Max Hahn's phone. Max, that's the only communication that I have with Max, and she was expressly told by the court not to bother his phone. Max sent me another message over the weekend that Mrs. Flacks took away his phone because Max decided to make popcorn. Judge, if Mr.

Speaker 0: Hahn is having such medical issues, I'm going to object to any further statements.

Speaker 2: Your Honor, you took away my contact with my son. The judge explicitly said during an FRO hearing that I had contact with my son. You're telling me all of a sudden because I heard that she's allowed to take away Max's phone.

Speaker 1: Sir, when you have...

Speaker 2: No, Your Honor, she's allowed to take away Max's phone.

Speaker 1: Sir, when your medical condition...

Speaker 2: No, Your Honor, that was completely uncalled for in regards to this. You're saying that because she can take away Max's phone, which is my only con to adhere, okay? You need to calm down. No, I'm not calming down. You have a medical issue. I know I have a medical issue, and you want to know something? If I drop dead in the EI, that's fine at this moment. But once again, Your Honor, she has taken away my right to see my son. She has taken away my contact with my son. She was expressly told by the court not to. This whole predicate, in regards to this whole thing, once again, is that she sent a document to the court claiming that that MLU was a signed and sealed agreement. It is not by the court's standards. So if you're telling me I need to sign a file, a separate memorandum on that, I will, okay? Sir... But in regards to all that, that house, that should be sold on sale. And if I drop dead on this thing, you know, so be it. But you want to know something, Your Honor?

Speaker 0: This is a complete thing with her, okay?

Speaker 2: And quite frankly, you're asking this case...

Speaker 1: We deserve it. We're continuing on the 13th of April. If we need to carry that, we will.

Speaker 2: Okay, the 13th of April has passed.

Speaker 1: I mean, of May.

Speaker 2: Okay, but once again, you're telling me I can't have contact with my son, but she takes away his phone.

Speaker 1: The TRO remains a full force and effect.

Speaker 2: Okay, part of that was that she was not to take away Max's phone. Bye, Mr.

Speaker 0: Hahn. For the record, I just want to be clear, I did hand Mr. Hahn a full set of exhibits. In case he doesn't bring them back to the next hearing, I'm not going to make another copy. Yes, that's right.

Speaker 1: Bring back your exhibits, Mr.

Speaker 2: Hahn. Thank you. In the meantime, I'm going to file a motion on the other matter.

Speaker 0: Your Honor, and just to be clear, the motions under this document are completely different from...

Speaker 1: I know, I know. It's a separate matter. Mr. Hahn.

Speaker 2: I know. Please stay with the MOU.

Speaker 1: I understand it's a separate matter. Mr. Hahn? Don't interrupt me. That's the end of today's hearing. I hope you get better, sir.

Speaker 2: Like I said, I'll file a separate thing in memory.

Speaker 1: Do whatever you want to do.

Speaker 0: I will. You can ask.
