

Speaker 1: There you go. That close enough for you?

Speaker 2: Yeah, I need to open it up and take some stuff out.

Speaker 0: Thank you.

Speaker 3: Let me know when you're ready. You may be your honor. Good afternoon, Mr. Black. And we do have to get the microphone for him, I hope. We have to get you the hearing device too, sir.

Speaker 2: I made sure I wore socks this time.

Speaker 3: You can't put your feet on the desk, sir.

Speaker 0: Okay, I'm going to put them on this chair, though.

Speaker 3: Is that acceptable? As long as you keep your socks on, I don't mind that. You need this for your health?

Speaker 0: Yes.

Speaker 2: You saw that letter.

Speaker 1: Here you go, Mr.

Speaker 2: Hahn. Oh, thank you so much, sir.

Speaker 1: Your volume controls are on the left side.

Speaker 3: Testing, do you hear me?

Speaker 1: Okay.

Speaker 3: All right, let me put this matter back on the record. This is docket number FV031946-22. This is the matter of Lisa F. Flax versus Glenn H.

Speaker 1: Hahn.

Speaker 3: I'm Judge Ambrose for the record. Today's date is May 13, 2022. The time is 1.52 p.m Counsel, may I have your appearance, please?

Speaker 0: Good afternoon, Your Honor. May it please the Court. Rebecca Berger from the firm of Kearney. This is out to your engineering on behalf of the plaintiff, Lisa Flax.

Speaker 3: Good afternoon, Mr. Hahn and Ms. Flax. Could you please raise your right hand? I'll need to swear both of you in again. Thank you. Do you swear or affirm that the testimony you are about to give the court will be...

Speaker 2: I'm sorry. This just died.

Speaker 3: Is it on at all? Nothing?

Speaker 0: No, um... Do you need a battery?

Speaker 2: I am on the left. No, I mean, when I try to turn it on...

Speaker 3: All right. We'll get Derek. We'll get Derek, rather.

Speaker 0: Is there a battery?

Speaker 3: That's okay. We'll get it done.

Speaker 2: Sir, I'm going to get you a new pair.

Speaker 1: Appreciate it. No problem.

Speaker 3: Are they rechargeable? It's going to be a few minutes. So, we'll get this charged up for you.

Speaker 2: You said you're going to get it charged?

Speaker 3: Yeah. Well, we have another one that's charged up.

Speaker 2: Okay, thank you.

Speaker 0: I appreciate it. Sorry for the delay, everyone.

Speaker 3: That's okay. Testing, testing. Thank you, Derek. Okay, so I'm sorry. I have to ask you to raise your right hand again. Do you swear or affirm that the testimony you are about to give the court will be the truth, the whole truth, and nothing but the truth? Ms. Flax? Yes. Thank you. Mr. Hahn?

Speaker 1: I do.

Speaker 3: Thank you. Okay, we had the start of the trial on April 27th, and it had to stop early because Mr. Hahn had a medical emergency. So, we're back, and you were continuing your direct examination of Ms. Flax, Ms. Berger, as far as my notes?

Speaker 0: I was. I just want to make some comments on the record, just so we're clear. Just because we were here last time, if there's ever a review in court, I want to make sure that we're clear. So, last time we were here, Your Honor provided all accommodations necessary for Mr. Hahn to the extent that he said he needed to put his feet up, and he took his shoes and socks off and put them on counsel table. He was provided ear, you know, listening devices. I just want to make it clear, last time he said he had top federal security clearance. This was affecting that. He also repeatedly objected throughout the first 15 minutes of testimony. He then made the claim that he was incompetent to proceed. I don't want Ms. Flax to have to do this again, quite frankly. So, I guess my concern right now is if Mr. Hahn's claim now is that he's incompetent, my request would be to do a competency exam. And we just remain within indefinite TRO unless Mr. Hahn has now decided he's no longer

incompetent. Because I think that needs to be clear on this record before we begin, because the last thing I want to do is have to bring Ms.

Speaker 3: Flax back for this again. I understand, Ms.

Speaker 0: Berger.

Speaker 3: Mr. Hahn, how are you doing, sir? I have provided everything I can to accommodate you. Are you able to understand and communicate with this court to conduct this hearing? Okay.

Speaker 2: So, I am on my medications right now. I am on my morphine.

Speaker 1: I am on my oxycodone.

Speaker 2: But I am actually looking for the court to determine, because Ms. Berger over here, even in her TRO that she submitted to you to get approval, mentions that I am on oxycodone and morphine. So, if she believes that it's not an issue, why did she mention it on the TRO to begin with?

Speaker 3: Well, I don't know. I wasn't in court on April 6th to or before Judge Morley, I believe. There was something about that court appearance. Is that right, Ms. Berger?

Speaker 0: Your Honor, there was, but I don't -- I mean, first of all, I personally didn't file the temporary restraining order. Again, Mr. Hahn keeps confusing the issues. I am not the party here. Ms. Flax is the party. Mr. Hahn wants to keep talking about me as the attorney. My job is simply to represent Ms. Flax. These are her allegations of what it is she is that has said and what has occurred. If Mr. Hahn cannot give clear answers and he is not clear, then Your Honor can order for him to have a competency exam so that we can have doctor verification to his competency. And then we can proceed so that our record is clear and that Your Honor, as well as myself and Ms. Flax are not doing this again sometime in the future on the basis of his now claim because he is not being clear in his answers. He can't claim in one mouth that he has top federal security clearance, he objects, he is participating in the proceeding, then claims he is not. and here we are again. We ask a direct question and he can't give direct answers. So in my opinion, the last thing I want to do is do this again. So if he cannot answer clearly, then a doctor can certainly evaluate him to determine his competency and be clear for this record that he can certainly proceed.

Speaker 2: I'm just saying, Your Honor, that she constantly references it. In one way she says I'm competent and in another way, when she does her filing and so forth, she submits paperwork saying he needs to have a 15-point follicle test or he needs to have another thing with Mr. Garcia for the young teen of time. And like I said, even on the TRO that they filed this time, they mentioned the fact that I'm on those medications. If it's not there...

Speaker 3: Sir, I don't concern myself with the allegations. I want to hear from your mouth. Okay. You drove here today, is that correct?

Speaker 2: That is correct.

Speaker 3: By yourself?

Speaker 2: By myself, Your Honor.

Speaker 3: And where did you drive from?

Speaker 2: Where I've been living at the last couple of months. My dad...

Speaker 3: How many miles away is that, sir?

Speaker 2: About 30 miles away.

Speaker 3: Okay. Did you have any problems coming here?

Speaker 2: No, absolutely not.

Speaker 0: Okay.

Speaker 3: Do you feel like you have the ability to continue with this trial?

Speaker 2: Yes. I was never arguing whether or not I was competent or not. What I was saying was I wasn't feeling good.

Speaker 1: However, Ms.

Speaker 2: Berger keeps using it either one way or the other throughout all these proceedings.

Speaker 3: Sir, I'm not concerned about the allegations. I'm concerned about what your feelings are and how you can conduct yourself at this trial. Are you able to conduct yourself today? Are you able to go forward? Do you understand what's happening here?

Speaker 2: Yes, I believe I do.

Speaker 3: Okay. So, you drove here. I drove here. You came up to the courtroom. You have all of your papers out.

Speaker 2: Yeah, I'm not saying that I was never incompetent, Your Honor.

Speaker 3: I want to understand this because last time when you fell... Yes. You did say you didn't understand anything.

Speaker 2: Well, because when I fell, my blood pressure, so I couldn't understand what was going on right then and there. I actually had a heart issue when I was in the hospital.

Speaker 3: Okay. As you sit here today, you're good to go, Mr. Hahn?

Speaker 2: I think as I sit here today, I'm good to go. So, if the Court is always ruling that I'm okay, then I'm to deal with Ms. Berger and her allegations through filing subsequent motions of where she filed to the Court and used that as leverage that I was incompetent because I was taking these medications. So, she can't have it both ways.

Speaker 3: Sir, I'm here on the domestic violence complaint. Okay. I'll hear from their case, okay? Yeah, that's fine. You're ready to proceed?

Speaker 2: I'm ready to proceed.

Speaker 3: I find you to be able to communicate to me accurately.

Speaker 1: And I'm not saying that I'm not.

Speaker 3: And you drove here today?

Speaker 2: I drove here and everything else.

Speaker 3: And you're ready to proceed?

Speaker 2: I'm ready to proceed.

Speaker 3: Do you appear like you're answering the questions clearly? You know what I'm asking?

Speaker 2: Right now, I guess. That's what I'm saying.

Speaker 3: So, Ms. Berger, I think that we can proceed. Thank you. And I don't want to bring you back, Ms. Black, for sure, because I know that you have issues with the illness. And I certainly don't want to put you through that either. So, I just want to make sure we don't have any issues like we did last time, Mr. Hahn, that you're all ready and there's no issues. You have all of your drinks next to you. You're accommodated with the wheelchair and the chair to lift your leg up. So, you're all ready to go.

Speaker 1: Yes, that's right. I agree with you.

Speaker 3: You have your hearing device. There's nothing else I could do for you, right?

Speaker 2: Right. And I'm agreeing with you 100%, Your Honor.

Speaker 3: And, sir, I've always treated you this way. I've always accommodated you, whatever accommodations you need. So, I want the record to reflect that as well.

Speaker 2: I would like to agree with parts of that, but that's fine. Let's move on.

Speaker 3: Okay. So, Ms. Berger, I find him able to do this today. I believe his answers are coaching, and he knows what we're doing. He

drove here. He doesn't present himself as somebody that doesn't know what's happening. So, I'd like to proceed.

Speaker 0: Thank you, Judge. You're welcome. So, prior to this matter being continued, we were on Exhibit 4, where we were talking about emails that were sent to me from Mr. Hahn. Is that correct?

Speaker 1: I'm sorry.

Speaker 0: Ms. Black. And you received these emails. Is that correct? Yes. And I provided them to you? Yes. And we were going through Exhibit 4. You had explained to the court that you do recognize that email address. Is that correct? Yes. And whose email address is that?

Speaker 1: One. Okay.

Speaker 0: And in this particular email, he states, "You and Lisa scorched Earth's process since the beginning. If only you and her were cooperative like a normal divorce, filing a TRO since Max wanted to stay with me for a week and has now caused her test. when Max JS 18, he's walking out of that house on her.". So, in the end, it's her that will lose out. Is that correct?

Speaker 1: Yes.

Speaker 0: He then goes on to say, "I spoke to New Jersey courts in Trenton. Obviously, I have a major complaint about Judge Ambrose and the retaliatory aspects of the case. So, they told me it was okay to continue file additional motion requests. So, I will and they will ensure we get a new judge assigned. Is that correct?".

Speaker 1: Yes.

Speaker 0: "Oh, and three is nothing in the law that will prevent me to say I'm glad that she will be dying of cancer someday. You can bring this to court. I really don't care like I said. The blog that I have will be read by the girls someday and they will learn all the aspects of the case like Max already knows. Is that correct?".

Speaker 1: Yes.

Speaker 0: And this, that email was at 4.25. Is that correct?

Speaker 1: Yes.

Speaker 0: The next email, that's exhibit 5, was sent at 4.31 p.m. by Mr.

Speaker 1: Tom.

Speaker 0: At the top of the email. 4.31. I apologize. 4.31.

Speaker 1: Yes.

Speaker 0: And that one reads, "If it wasn't for your scorched earth policy, we could have made this whole thing easier.". Yes. It also says, "And please continue to threaten me about it. And I am not contacting anyone nor am I ordered by the court to do so. So, go F yourself. You and her deserve it."

Speaker 1: Yes.

Speaker 0: Is that correct?

Speaker 1: Uh-huh.

Speaker 0: Moving on to plaintiff's exhibit 6. That was sent.

Speaker 1: I apologize.

Speaker 0: Bless you. Thank you.

Speaker 3: There's tissues if you need them.

Speaker 0: Right here. Thank you. Also on March 24, 2022, at 5.05 p.m. Is that correct?

Speaker 1: Yes.

Speaker 0: Again, that one reads, "And you viciously attacked me in court since again you wanted me out if the house and I am out. You and her wanted the scorched earth policy of hers."

Speaker 1: Yes.

Speaker 0: And then moving to plaintiff's exhibit 7. that also was sent on March 24, 2022, at 5.06. Is that correct? Yes. And that reads, "Once again, I am out if the house and you threatened once again about the police, so I have no inclination to help you gain entry to the house.". Is that correct? And what was the concern about getting in the house?

Speaker 1: There were. the people buying the house had an inspection set up to go see the house.

Speaker 0: And who was the person who had the access to the house? Did he, was the inspection able to occur on March 24?

Speaker 1: No, it was not. They were all standing there unable to get in.

Speaker 0: Did Mr. Hong send another email the next day on Saturday, on Friday, March 25?

Speaker 1: Yes.

Speaker 0: And I'm going to direct your attention to exhibit 8. Do you recognize that document? What do you recognize it to be?

Speaker 1: Glenn's saying that...

Speaker 0: What kind of document? Let's just start with it.

Speaker 1: Oh, it's an email. Okay. To Ms. Berger.

Speaker 0: And who was it sent by? Glenn. And were you provided with this email?

Speaker 1: Yes.

Speaker 0: And what time was it sent? 1243 AM. On what date?

Speaker 1: Friday, March 25.

Speaker 0: Was that sent from the same email address you previously identified as Mr. Hong's? And I'd like to enter into evidence exhibit 8.

Speaker 3: Okay. Mr. Hong, any objection?

Speaker 2: Oh, no. Since I'm not objecting them, I can do it on a cross motion, right? Do you ask her questions about these?

Speaker 3: You'll be given the opportunity to cross-examine them.

Speaker 2: Okay. That's what I'm asking.

Speaker 1: All right.

Speaker 3: So, P8 is moved. And just for the record, P4 through 7 were already moved.

Speaker 0: Your Honor, yes. For the record's purposes, as far as I remember and recall, was exhibits 1 through 7 were in evidence. That's correct.

Speaker 3: So is this.

Speaker 0: Thank you, Your Honor. And in this email, it states, "I plan on stopping by Saturday morning to the house. Apparently, I left the medicine for Missy Rose in the medicine cabinet.". Was that his message? I'm going to direct your attention. Did he send another email on Saturday, March 26? Yes. And was it sent at 1.33 PM?

Speaker 1: Yes.

Speaker 0: And do you recognize that to be the same email address being utilized by Mr. Hong? Yes. And were you provided with a copy of this email? Yes. Your Honor, at this time, I'd like to admit into evidence P9, exhibits P9.

Speaker 3: Mr. Hong, any objection to P9?



Speaker 2: Can I just ask one question, just to make sure I'm on the same page? If you look at P9, right, the top of it, the bottom of it, where it has from M&T Bank?

Speaker 1: Uh-huh.

Speaker 2: Okay. Since I'm not objecting to this going in, it's both that message that she referenced to, plus the important notification that's on the same page, right?

Speaker 3: Yes, it's the document. Okay. P9 has its represented right.

Speaker 2: Okay, I just wanted to make sure.

Speaker 1: Thank you, sir.

Speaker 3: Is that correct, Miss Berger?

Speaker 0: Yes, Judge, it's actually three pages long, so that helps Mr. Hong.

Speaker 3: So, yes, that's moved into evidence.

Speaker 1: Okay, thank you.

Speaker 0: And in that particular email, what is he accusing you of?

Speaker 1: Some kind of scam.

Speaker 0: Do you have any idea what he was talking about?

Speaker 1: I don't.

Speaker 0: How do you and Mr. Hong communicate?

Speaker 1: In Family Wizard.

Speaker 0: Are you able to speak on the phone? No. Do you speak in text? No. Do you speak in email?

Speaker 1: No.

Speaker 0: Is Our Family Wizard the only form of communication that you have?

Speaker 1: Yes.

Speaker 0: So in P9, it states, "As you know, she had an illegal credit scam on me, and us, she, doing this again.". And again, I'm reading verbatim, Judge, so if it doesn't sound... "I know you won't respond back to the email to cover her illegal activities against her. As soon as Max turns 18 and walks out, he will file against her for all the malicious that she has been doing at that point. I don't think you can prevent Max

in court at age 18. I'm filing a new motion on Friday. I'll email you a copy." And below that, he has attached something from what looks and appears to be an email to him through M&T Bank. Is that correct?

Speaker 1: Yes.

Speaker 0: Do you have any idea what he's talking about?

Speaker 1: No.

Speaker 0: And were you provided a copy of this email by myself? Now, you said that you actually communicate with Mr. Hahn on Our Family Wizard. I'm going to direct your attention to Exhibit 10. Do you recognize those documents?

Speaker 1: Yes.

Speaker 0: What do you recognize them to be?

Speaker 1: There are some of Our Family Wizard messages.

Speaker 0: Okay. And who's listed as the parties? who are the ones communicating in Our Family Wizard?

Speaker 1: Quite a lot of stuff.

Speaker 0: Your Honor, at this time, I'd like to enter into Evidence Exhibit 10.

Speaker 3: Mr. Hahn, any objections to 10?

Speaker 2: Oh, absolutely not.

Speaker 3: Okay, sir. Moved in evidence.

Speaker 0: Thank you, Judge. And P10 consists of two pages, is that correct?

Speaker 1: Yes.

Speaker 0: And if we look at this Message 2 of that, it was from March 25, 2002, at 1234 AM.

Speaker 1: Yes.

Speaker 0: And he's saying to you, "That's fine, I can move decision day to the following weekend." Is that correct? Yes. He then sends you another email at 1250 AM that same day, is that correct?

Speaker 1: Yes.

Speaker 0: Are you responding back to him at all? No. As I reminded your attorney, this is TGE, nastiness, that you are just -- because I wanted to plan something special, you can't handle it and be cooperative.

Max and I can't wait until he is 18 and on his birthday he will just walk out of your house and you will lose any relationship you think you have with him. I have a special Disney trip planned for him for his 18th birthday, is that correct?

Speaker 1: Yes.

Speaker 0: The next day, on March 26, 2022, at 923 PM, is he continuing to send you our family wizard messages? Yes. And he goes on to state, "He was not taking because you wanted to switch this weekend with next as it worked better in your favor. because of pass over then because I mentioned about Friday night you renege in the trading of weekends. Let's be clear here and I know exactly what games you are playing. and as Max texted me once again you are disparaging me in front of Max which is clearly a new violation of the children's bill of rights as well as my dad has visitation with the kids, another violation as he is allowed to have his own time separate from mine under the NJ child bill of rights. Do you have any idea what he is talking about? No. Are you responding to him? No. I've already formed your attorney that not only is the judge in trouble with the state, I gave a deposition EITJ, the state court investigators are on his conduct and your lawyer's conduct in our recent court, they advised me, I clearly can send in new motions. so I plan on filing new motions on Friday and will email the copy to your attorney and drop it off to her office next Friday. Is that correct?

Speaker 1: Yes.

Speaker 0: But I also advise her that as you know Max is planning on walking out on his 18th birthday and not only are we going to Disney and enjoy a nice visit using my Disney points but Max is going to file as the prosecution and you as the defendant the many years he had to endure the many years of child abuse that you kept him away from his father. Is that correct? Yes. And does he go on to continue to say, so either way as you're dealing with your cancer, your H-O-I-G-Y-O have Y-O, deal with this issue of your own making, then the truth comes out. if all the malicious activities and lies that you have, you have told him and the kids. I hope you are able to derive when the truth comes out from your own child. Is that correct?

Speaker 1: Yes.

Speaker 0: He then continued, are you even responding to him at this point? Does he continue to send you messages?

Speaker 1: Yes.

Speaker 0: So the next morning at 852 March 27, 2022, does he continue to send you messages? Yes. That's at 852 a.m.? ? Yes. Does it matter? I have the text messages from Max. Sadly, I know I'll be here longer than you and once that happens, I can deprogram the girls. You'll not be known as a living mother but someone who is malicious. That's what the kids will know about you when you are no longer around. I don't foresee any visitors and you'll eventually, like everyone, pass away and would not expect any stones placed on your marker. Why is that significant?

Speaker 1: In the Jewish religion, when you go to visit a grave, you put a stone to show that you're there.

Speaker 0: And he continues to go on, they will despise you for your actions. Is that correct?

Speaker 1: Yes.

Speaker 0: As you know, you will only be remembered for your last actions and Max's suit against you. Keep telling yourself, it's me who did not want Max this weekend. It was your idea to trade weekends. Of course, all that matters. and remember, I'll have the last word with the kids, not you. And you'll end up being very lonely. Just remember your actions now. You are punishing me but I see it as you only have a year and a half more with Max and I'll have the rest of my life. Is that correct?

Speaker 1: Yes.

Speaker 0: How did you feel when you were receiving these messages?

Speaker 1: Very threatened, very sad. Of course, scared with my own illness, thrown in my face and my kids involved.

Speaker 0: How long has he been talking about your illness now?

Speaker 1: Since I've had it, which is the end of 2017.

Speaker 0: And when did he find out?

Speaker 2: Can you please say that a little bit louder? I didn't hear what her response was, my apologies.

Speaker 1: Since I was diagnosed, the end of 2017.

Speaker 0: And your reoccurrence markers came back in July of 2021, is that correct? And how long has he been making comments now?

Speaker 1: Since July.

Speaker 0: Of 2021? Yes. When did you go to the house for the first time?

Speaker 1: Do you mean in March?

Speaker 0: Yes. March 30th. And why did you wait until Wednesday, March 30th?

Speaker 1: That was the court order from March 14th, saying that we, that Glenn had to be out of the house 30 days prior to settlement.

Speaker 0: And what happened when you went into the house for the first time? Were you able to get in?

Speaker 1: No.

Speaker 0: What did you have to do?

Speaker 1: I had to call a blacksmith to get in.

Speaker 0: Did you ultimately get into the house?

Speaker 1: Yes.

Speaker 0: What did you discover when you walked into the house?

Speaker 1: It was like a horror movie. There was graffiti all over the walls.

Speaker 0: You can tell me and then we're going to... What do you think "Scorch Earth" means?

Speaker 1: It's a military terroristic threat, meaning I'm going to destroy everything in your path until I get to you.

Speaker 0: How did you feel about that?

Speaker 1: Scared. Why? And horrified that someone would do that, especially the father of my kid. Because I'm afraid he's going to hurt not only me, but the people and things I care about.

Speaker 0: So what else was around the house as you went through the house?

Speaker 1: Some more graffiti.

Speaker 0: Describe the... so if you're walking downstairs, explain to the court what you were saying.

Speaker 1: Oh, okay. So most of the furniture was removed, but there was four litter boxes and litter all over. When we went in the kitchen, there was a pot of baked beans on the stove molded over. The dishes filled up. There was popcorn all over the floor in the family room.

Speaker 0: What was on the table in the kitchen?

Speaker 1: On the kitchen table was a baggie filled with what looked like cat feces and my jewelry in it.

Speaker 0: Was Mr. Hahn supposed to give you this jewelry?

Speaker 3: Mr. Berger. Yes, sir.

Speaker 2: When I went through this thing, I never saw any pictures of the set bag of cat feces. Is that something that you have here today, Mr. Berger?

Speaker 3: Hold on. This is her case.

Speaker 2: Oh, I'm sorry. I'm sorry.

Speaker 3: Don't make a statement unless you have an objection.

Speaker 2: Okay, I'll object. Okay, thank you.

Speaker 3: All right, Mr. Berger, you may continue.

Speaker 0: Thank you. Did you expect that Mr. Hahn would have returned your jewelry?

Speaker 1: No.

Speaker 0: And what has been the issue in the litigation over in your divorce litigation? Are you divorced now, correct? Yes. What was the issue in your divorce litigation and even post-litigation?

Speaker 1: One of the issues is that Glenn has a coin collection of my father's that he's supposed to return to me along with some jewelry, a pocket watch, my grandmother's mantle clock, and there was many times where he was supposed to bring it to Rebecca's office and sent stray boxes basically with a carrier.

Speaker 0: And were there other photographs that had to be provided to you as well?

Speaker 1: Yes, I'm sorry. There was three photo albums in there.

Speaker 0: So as you're going downstairs, can you explain to the court what the house looked like?

Speaker 1: Do you mean upstairs?

Speaker 0: No, downstairs. On the walls.

Speaker 1: Oh, that was all. that was downstairs.

Speaker 0: The rest was upstairs. What did you find in the garage?

Speaker 1: Oh, I'm sorry. The wires to the garage door opener were cut. If you remember, Mr. Hahn had wanted to take the garage doors and the back door, so instead he just cut the wires so they couldn't be used.

Speaker 0: Did the judge order that Mr. Hahn was not permitted to take the garage door and the sliding doors?

Speaker 1: Yes.

Speaker 0: When you went up to the second floor, what did you discover?

Speaker 1: In the upstairs hallway was more graffiti saying how now that black, which is my last name, cancer cow. And then in the bathroom, it

said something like on the bathroom wall, the whole wall was like your brother and sister or a pair of effing something. And then the doors were painted downstairs in the laundry room, too. The cabinets were spray painted above the washer dryer. The whole garage door was spray painted. Inside the medicine cabinet upstairs was painted.

Speaker 0: The sink was painted.

Speaker 1: The six panel door, certain panels were painted. There's cat vomit all over.

Speaker 0: Where is this shower in the house?

Speaker 1: Upstairs.

Speaker 0: Okay. And what was it like in the master bedroom?

Speaker 1: A lot of furniture was removed, but there was trash like all over the floor of pudding cups and cakes and not tasty cakes, what are they called, like ringding or whatever. Hostess cupcakes and dots and Pepsi bottles and candy wrappers.

Speaker 0: How did you feel when you saw all of this?

Speaker 1: It was disgusting.

Speaker 0: How did it make you feel when you saw all the things written on the wall?

Speaker 1: Scared. It felt like a horror movie.

Speaker 0: And did you videotape that?

Speaker 1: Yes.

Speaker 0: And did you provide me a copy of that? I'm going to show you what's been marked plain as exhibit 11. Do you recognize that?

Speaker 1: Yeah.

Speaker 0: And did you review this disc at the time?

Speaker 1: Yeah.

Speaker 0: And does it contain the video that you took that day? And this is March 30th of 2022? You know, I'd like to play the video.

Speaker 3: It should move, yes.

Speaker 2: Yes. This is now marked as, is this 11?

Speaker 3: P11.

Speaker 2: Okay, I just want to make sure I'm following along.

Speaker 0: Can you freeze that for a second?

Speaker 1: Video cameras on the outside in the garage all around.

Speaker 3: And Mr. Hahn, why did you want us to stop it?

Speaker 2: Did you need me to stop it, General? Yeah, I couldn't see. Can you please back it up for a second?

Speaker 3: Actually, I didn't make a decision.

Speaker 2: Okay, now, can you back it up, do you mind? From where the point was where you opened up the front door looking out. Okay, it's coming down. Thank you.

Speaker 1: I'm starting it from the beginning.

Speaker 3: Let's play it through all of them, and if you need us to replay, we will.

Speaker 2: Yeah, I'm looking for something specific, Your Honor. I just want to make sure. And I guess this was taken on March 30th?

Speaker 3: March 30th, yes.

Speaker 2: Is that what it said? Okay.

Speaker 1: Okay, freeze. Hold on, let's play it through.

Speaker 2: Okay, I couldn't see.

Speaker 0: I don't know why it keeps switching, Judge.

Speaker 3: Yeah, hold on, something's not right. It's switching. It's staying on line. All right, Mr. Hahn, we'll get to see it one more time.

Speaker 2: Okay, thank you. Is there any way you can just slow down the speed of this, Ms. Parker?

Speaker 3: I can't. We'll watch it again if you need it.

Speaker 1: Okay. Can you stop that for one second now?

Speaker 3: Hold on, let it play, Ms. Parker. Yeah, um, is it possible to set your laptop up? so maybe it's over here? And I don't know if we can figure that out.

Speaker 1: You mean?

Speaker 3: I don't know, yeah, just without the Polycom, I don't know why it's doing this.



Speaker 1: Okay, I mean, I can put it here so that everyone can see it. Yeah.

Speaker 3: That's certainly fine for me. Mr. Hahn, if you need it closer, we'll make it closer for you.

Speaker 1: You can play it one more time. Thank you.

Speaker 2: I just need to check for some identifiable objects.

Speaker 1: Yeah, that's fine. I can see it. Is this the only video on this report?

Speaker 0: Perfect. There's this one and another one.

Speaker 3: Let them play it and then I'll have it.

Speaker 2: Jack, can you, do you mind? Can you please come a little bit closer? I don't bite.

Speaker 0: Yeah, that's okay.

Speaker 3: How long is that video?

Speaker 0: It is...

Speaker 2: I don't need to see all five minutes. I just want to see as a reference for my...

Speaker 0: Yeah, I mean, I think we need to... I can continue and then we can come back to it. It's totally fine.

Speaker 3: Okay, Leah is going to try to get this repaired. Okay, thank you.

Speaker 0: Not a problem. Not a problem. Did you take photographs as well of the damage?

Speaker 1: Yes.

Speaker 0: I'm going to ask you to look at exhibits 12 through 19. And do you recognize them?

Speaker 1: Yes, those are the graffiti as I followed.

Speaker 0: And did you take those photographs?

Speaker 1: I probably took some and my sister Pam Kurtz probably took some.

Speaker 0: And were they taken? Can you just repeat that louder?

Speaker 2: Who took the photographs?

Speaker 1: I took some and probably my sister Pam Kurtz took some.

Speaker 0: Were they taken on March 30th of 2022? Do the photographs of exhibits, plaintiff's exhibits 12 through 19 accurately... I'm sorry, 18 accurately reflect the condition of the house as you found it on March 30th of 2022?

Speaker 1: Yes.

Speaker 0: And I'd like to enter into evidence exhibits 12 through 18.

Speaker 3: Any objection, Mr. Hahn?

Speaker 2: Absolutely not, Your Honor.

Speaker 3: Okay, P12 through P19 are moved into evidence.

Speaker 0: Okay, and so if we just look quickly, we're going to go through these pretty quickly. Exhibit 12, can you tell to the court what exactly is in that photograph?

Speaker 1: That is the laundry room with the words "Scorched Earth."

Speaker 0: Was this the same phrase that was being used by Mr. Hahn in the e-mails? Moving to plaintiff's exhibit 13, can you tell the court what that is?

Speaker 1: Yeah, that's one of the parts of the six panel door inside the bathroom upstairs. Excuse me?

Speaker 2: I'm sorry to interrupt, but upstairs bathroom, which bathroom, please?

Speaker 1: The hall bath.

Speaker 2: The cat one, right?

Speaker 1: Yeah.

Speaker 2: Okay, just want to make sure.

Speaker 3: So this is the hallway? Okay, thank you.

Speaker 0: If you can just keep your voice up, because I know you have the mask on, so I just want to make sure. Judge, just so we're clear, she has an infection from her last surgery and has a drain in, so she has to keep her mask on.

Speaker 3: No worries.

Speaker 0: Thank you, Judge. Moving to appliance exhibit 14, can you tell the court what that was?

Speaker 1: This was painted on the wall in the upstairs hall bathroom. No, sorry. This was painted on the wall in the upstairs hallway saying, "How now, fat, cancer, flax, cow.".

Speaker 0: Have you made any announcements on social media about your current condition?

Speaker 1: No.

Speaker 3: Mr. Hahn, what do you have to say?

Speaker 2: I just -- there's two hallways upstairs, right? So there's a hallway, there's a main hallway upstairs. I just don't know which wall this was on.

Speaker 1: There's only one hall.

Speaker 3: I'll do that on the --. You're going to get to cross-examine, so -- Okay, okay.

Speaker 2: I just want to make sure.

Speaker 3: All right, miss.

Speaker 0: And when did you start using the last name flax?

Speaker 1: At my divorce, which was June 25, 2020.

Speaker 0: When was the last time you had been in the house?

Speaker 1: January 6, 2019.

Speaker 0: And what was that going to do?

Speaker 1: That was -- we had gotten permission from the courts to move some of my inherited items out.

Speaker 0: And that was over three years ago, is that correct?

Speaker 1: Yes.

Speaker 0: And who's been in the house since that time?

Speaker 1: Glenn.

Speaker 0: Moving to exhibit 15. Can you tell the court what's in that photo?

Speaker 1: This is the upstairs hall bathroom. On the wall, you can actually see the tile bar. It says, "Her brother and sis are a pair of effin' mess" -- something we couldn't read the end.

Speaker 0: How has Mr. Hahn behaved towards your brother and your sister?

Speaker 1: Especially my brother with hatred. And my sister, too.

Speaker 0: Can you give some examples to the court?

Speaker 1: Saying that -- constantly saying that my brother's threatening him, which he never has, which is interesting. And saying that my sister shouldn't drive the kids or he had listed the -- at one point he listed my sister. Should have supervised visits with the kids.

Speaker 0: So, from your knowledge, does Mr. Hahn like your brother and sister?

Speaker 1: Not at all.

Speaker 0: Moving to Plains exhibit 16. Tell the court what's in that photo.

Speaker 1: That is the laundry room. Kind of the opposite side where it said "scorched earth." So there's cabinets above. You can see the washer/dryer.

Speaker 0: And moving to Plains exhibit 17.

Speaker 1: That's the bottom of that bathroom message. "Her brother and sis are a pair of effin' mess" -- something.

Speaker 0: Moving to Plains exhibit 18.

Speaker 1: That's the laundry room. So that's the inside of the garage door. Like that leads to the garage.

Speaker 0: And does the video -- so are these all the photographs of the damage?

Speaker 1: Of the paint? -- oh, no. Actually, there was -- inside the hall bathroom medicine cabinet, inside the hall bathroom vanity doors. Hall bathroom sink was green.

Speaker 0: Is there more depicted on the video? Yeah. Judge, I'll just wait until IT comes in order to address that.

Speaker 1: Anybody?

Speaker 0: And that's fine. I can continue to go when I come back.

Speaker 3: Judge is totally fine. Okay.

Speaker 1: Thank you.

Speaker 0: How did you interpret what Mr. Hahn had done? Who did you believe did the damage?

Speaker 1: Definitely Mr. Hahn.

Speaker 0: And why did you believe it was him?

Speaker 1: The scorched earth comment that he had mentioned so many times before. The use of my maiden name along with the cancer. And along with the cow. That was something of many years ago with my brother. And he was in a wait over Halloween costume with my brother.

Speaker 0: And what was the Halloween costume?

Speaker 1: Glenn had dressed up as a Dalmatian. And my brother thought he was a cow. And Glenn was always very insulted by that.

Speaker 3: Um... Hello. Um, IT, if you want to just explain to him. It keeps on clicking from HDMI 2 back to the Polycom. I don't know why. Uh, yes, the Polycom likes to take over. Oh, okay. It's probably a five minute CD-ROM video.

Speaker 1: Okay, thank you. Hold this question, please.

Speaker 3: Wait, wait till we get done. Okay, Mr. Hahn had a question about, I think, the cat question? Yes. Go ahead, Mr. Hahn.

Speaker 2: No, you, Ms. Berger, you said something and Ms. Flaxley, I didn't hear your question.

Speaker 0: Oh, Ms. Flaxley, this picture of the cat on the wall.

Speaker 1: No.

Speaker 0: Your Honor, at this time, I'd like to... Let me ask Ms. Flaxley, was that the video you made on March 30th of 2022?

Speaker 1: Yes.

Speaker 0: Your Honor, I'd like to enter into evidence exhibit 11.

Speaker 3: Mr. Hahn, any objection?

Speaker 2: No, absolutely not.

Speaker 3: Okay, it's moved into evidence.

Speaker 0: Thank you, Judge. After you saw the damage in the house, what did you do?

Speaker 1: I called the police.

Speaker 0: Did you get, as a result of which, were criminal charges filed? And did you file for a restraining order?

Speaker 1: Yes.

Speaker 0: Okay, I'm going to show you what's been marked as claims exhibit 20. Do you recognize it?

Speaker 1: Yes.

Speaker 0: And what do you recognize it to be?

Speaker 1: The URL.

Speaker 0: And thereafter, was it amended to fix your name? Yes. And is that exhibit, claims exhibit 21?

Speaker 1: Yes.

Speaker 0: And that's dated April 1st of 2022, second page? And thereafter, did you amend the restraining order yourself?

Speaker 1: Yes.

Speaker 0: And why did you amend it?

Speaker 1: To add some of the previous...

Speaker 0: And what date was that filed? Go to the second page.

Speaker 1: March 11th.

Speaker 0: March or April?

Speaker 1: April, sorry.

Speaker 0: And I'd like to enter into evidence the temporary restraining order exhibit 20 through 22.

Speaker 3: Any objection, Mr.

Speaker 2: Hall? Absolutely not.

Speaker 3: Moved into evidence P20, 21, and 22.

Speaker 0: Thank you. After the restraining order was filed, did you appear in court for an adjournment?

Speaker 1: Yes.

Speaker 0: When you went to the court, what happened at that appearance in court?

Speaker 1: During that appearance, Mr. Hahn had requested to go back to the house with an officer because something was buried in the backyard.

Speaker 0: Were you concerned about that? Yeah.

Speaker 1: I mean, I just didn't know what he would have buried in the backyard.

Speaker 0: And thereafter, after you left that day, did you discover what it is that he had buried in the backyard? Yes. Or what was in the backyard?

Speaker 1: Yes.

Speaker 0: And I'm going to show you what's been marked cleanups exhibit 55. Do you recognize this?

Speaker 1: Yeah.

Speaker 0: What do you recognize it to be?

Speaker 1: This is, the buried in the backyard was like an open little rubber made coat and filled with pictures of my grandparents' original frame wedding portrait, my oldest daughter's baby book with her baby naming, my childhood pictures that are now my grandparents' picture.

Speaker 3: And what's the designation of that exhibit?

Speaker 0: Cleanups exhibit 55.

Speaker 2: Is that what you said, 55?

Speaker 3: Yes.

Speaker 1: A lot of it I can't even make out because it's so ruined, but it's all pictures of me as a kid, me with my brother and sister.

Speaker 0: You can make out it says Lisa at the bottom and memories at the top.

Speaker 1: Yeah. They're all photographs, but it's just so hard to figure out even what they were. That looks like a wedding portrait.

Speaker 0: And these frames, how do you know that they were?

Speaker 1: I know that's the frame from my grandmother's house that has her wedding picture in it.

Speaker 0: It was all over the house.

Speaker 1: This is Bailey's baby book. You can see it's got our baby on the front and it's from her baby naming and there's nothing left of it.

Speaker 2: And this was the stuff that was buried in the backyard?

Speaker 1: Yeah. Yes, sir.

Speaker 3: Just let her testify.

Speaker 1: I don't know what those pictures are. The slides are being a pile of pictures. I can't even make them out anymore.

Speaker 0: Are they completely just fused together with the other pictures?

Speaker 1: Mm-hmm. I knew I had made out some childhood pictures of ours when we first pulled it.

Speaker 0: And how can you tell if they're photographs?

Speaker 1: You can see the residue, some frames, and I recognize that Caribbean bag. I remember having a pile of pictures in there. I just don't remember which ones were in there. When you saw, like I said, I did remember some of our child, my brother and sister, my childhood pictures of us as kids, my sister and I in the same dresses for holiday. How did you feel when you saw that? Angry, sad, and scared because he keeps referencing my death and then he buried pictures of me and those I loved.

Speaker 0: What did he call this in court?

Speaker 1: A time capsule.

Speaker 0: When you have a time capsule, did you ever bury a time capsule in the backyard?

Speaker 1: No.

Speaker 0: And if you had a time capsule, what would you do?

Speaker 1: I would seal it so that nothing would happen to it.

Speaker 0: Because what's the purpose of a time capsule?

Speaker 1: To look on it many years later to show future generations what life was like.

Speaker 0: Are you able to show any future generations what life was like with that?

Speaker 1: Memories.

Speaker 0: And artifacts of my family. What was your relationship like during the marriage with Mr. Hahn?

Speaker 1: He was very controlling. We would see how long we would stay.

Speaker 0: How would he speak to you?

Speaker 1: He would speak down to me and then it wouldn't even matter where we were. It wasn't even just in private. It would be in the middle of a party, it would be in the middle of a store, whatever. It would be embarrassing.



Speaker 0: And what was his tone?

Speaker 1: He would yell.

Speaker 0: And how often would this occur?

Speaker 1: Pretty frequently. It was like walking on eggshells. It got worse as time went on.

Speaker 0: And what would he do on holidays?

Speaker 1: If the holidays were something focused on me, they would always end up with me crying upstairs. They would always be ruined to somehow not.

Speaker 0: What did he do on a trip to Florida?

Speaker 1: We drove to Florida with my mom and her twin sister. And he kind of had a role. He had opposing political sides from my mother. Both felt strongly about their sides. No one is to speak about politics. So my mother mentioned the name of her person. So we went across three lanes of traffic, stopped the car and told her to get out.

Speaker 0: Who was in the car?

Speaker 1: The kids, myself, Glenn, my mom and aunt.

Speaker 0: Was he concerned about the safety of anyone in that vehicle?

Speaker 1: No.

Speaker 0: What would he do? How would he want to contact you? What would he do?

Speaker 1: He would call, text.

Speaker 0: How often? Would he do this type of contact when you were in work?

Speaker 1: Especially after we left.

Speaker 0: And what would happen if you didn't answer?

Speaker 1: He'd call the kids. Regardless of the time, or text the kids. He'd usually text the kids.

Speaker 0: And would this be repetitively in a row?

Speaker 1: Yeah. But it would be like crazy times at night that he'd be texting.

Speaker 0: And what did he like to do with your phone?

Speaker 1: He was tracking my phone, my texting.

Speaker 0: Was he reading your text?

Speaker 1: Yeah.

Speaker 0: How did he treat your family?

Speaker 1: As we said before, he didn't like my family, would speak negatively, even of my cousins and stuff.

Speaker 0: Did he like you to go there?

Speaker 1: No, that's why there'd always be a guilt feeling, or a time limit, or something. We can only stay for so long. Or guilty if I went by myself. I wanted to do family stuff.

Speaker 0: And if he went, what would he do in terms of contact? In terms of contact, would he try to call you when you were there?

Speaker 1: Yeah, he'd say it was when he was in hand, or whatever.

Speaker 0: How did he behave when you were first in the hospital in December of 2017, when you were first diagnosed with cancer? Things went bad.

Speaker 1: And I went septic and then a coma. And during that time, he didn't let my family talk to doctors. Even when I was out of the coma, he didn't let me talk to doctors. He wanted power of attorney.

Speaker 0: Did you want him to have power of attorney?

Speaker 1: I wanted him to be part with my brother and sister, and he would not allow that to happen. He threatened to divorce me while I was in the ICU.

Speaker 0: Why did you want your sister and brother to be part of that power of attorney?

Speaker 1: Because I knew they'd look after him.

Speaker 0: Did you not trust him?

Speaker 2: No.

Speaker 0: In the summer of 2018, what did you discover?

Speaker 1: I discovered that I got a call from a collection agency about a credit card. It was that they said we have money on a credit card that I never heard of. And I said, "You know, it can't be ours.". And they said, "Well, can you check with who else was in the house?". And Glenn came home from work that night, and he's like, "It's ours. Just pay it.". I never heard of it, but I paid it.

Speaker 0: What occurred about a month later after when they were getting ready to start school?

Speaker 1: Families getting ready to start school. Then at the high school they can take college level classes, so you can pay at community college to take college class credits. And since Glenn had been, whatever, I was recovering from cancer and Glenn was recovering from a car accident. I said, "Let's use the money.". I'd been putting away \$750 a month for babies in my credit union right out of my paycheck.

Speaker 0: Whose name was on the credit?

Speaker 1: Just my name. I'd had it even before I was married. And I kept saying, "We haven't heard from them.". Like I said, I didn't do the finances. I'm going to go over and see what's in that account.

Speaker 0: When you wanted to use money, who did you have to ask?

Speaker 1: Glenn. And he had made a false statement about the credit union account.

Speaker 0: How did you know it was false?

Speaker 1: Because when I had a workshop over near where that credit union was, and I said I was going to go into the bank, and there was \$11. So upon research, every month, as quick as my \$750 went in, he had transferred it out to our joint account and then to another account that I was on.

Speaker 0: And now we're moving into the fall of 2018. What occurred at that point?

Speaker 1: Then Bailey had, that's the oldest, had her PSAT test, and we went out that morning, I was going to drive her to school, and the car was repossessed.

Speaker 0: Did you start asking Mr. Hahn about what happened?

Speaker 1: Yeah, well then the pieces were starting to come together at that point. There have been lies and things hidden from me.

Speaker 0: Did you move out of the house?

Speaker 1: Yes.

Speaker 0: When did you move out of the house?

Speaker 1: We had an issue with the heater, so as it got chilly, my sister and brother-in-law had invited us to stay with them because we were told not to turn the heater on, that it was too big a unit for the house, and it was dangerous.

Speaker 0: So what day was this that you moved out?

Speaker 1: October 16, 2018.

Speaker 0: And who moved out with you?

Speaker 1: The three children and myself.

Speaker 0: Did Mr. Hahn want to move out of the house?

Speaker 1: No.

Speaker 0: What was Mr. Hahn doing with the mail?

Speaker 1: He had been hiding, when I went to get stuff

Speaker 0: from the house, I

Speaker 1: saw that there was a drawstring bag of my mail by his side of the bed, a whole bag full of unopened mail of mine, even with, I think there was court stuff in there, credit cards that I didn't know that he had wrapped up bills, and \$30,000, and stuff that was just in my name even, and credit cards that I didn't know about. So he had climbed up for in my name.

Speaker 0: Did he try to apologize to you for his behavior?

Speaker 1: Yes.

Speaker 0: I'm going to show you, and how did he try to, in what form? In text. I'm going to show you what's been issued to turn your attention to exhibit 23. Do you recognize it?

Speaker 1: Yes.

Speaker 0: And what do you recognize it to be?

Speaker 1: It was Glenn saying that he...

Speaker 0: Whose text was it?

Speaker 1: First, it was...

Speaker 0: Not necessarily the content, I'm asking you who...

Speaker 1: Oh, it's between me and Glenn.

Speaker 0: So, who's in the dark spot of the text message?

Speaker 1: I am.

Speaker 0: And who's in the white spot of the text message? Glenn is. And who was this sent to?

Speaker 1: It's between me and Glenn.

Speaker 0: Was this, yes. And it was this October 29th of 2018?

Speaker 1: Yes.

Speaker 0: Your Honor, at this time I'd like to enter into evidence, please, exhibit 23.

Speaker 3: Any objections, Mr. Hahn?

Speaker 2: No, not at all, but can we just take a five minute break so I can stretch my leg?

Speaker 1: Sure.

Speaker 3: Okay, let's take a break. Ten after three.

Speaker 1: Yeah, thank you.
