

Speaker 2: OK, OK, I'll tell you what, can I call, can they call me back tomorrow and we can set this thing up?

Speaker 1: I'm walking back into the court now, so we can get this expert witness, 883-5497.

Speaker 2: I'm sorry, I'm 5497, I'm sorry Ron, I was lining up a computer expert witness about the file.

Speaker 1: OK, I was just talking to the judge. So, it's 883-5497, yes, on HANN, oh wait, 18954, no, I'll have to call me back, I'm in the middle of court, I'm embarrassing you in front of the court, thank you, bye. I'm sorry about that, Ron, I needed to line up an expert witness on the file.

Speaker 0: Let me just put this matter back on the record, go ahead Mr.

Speaker 1: Just so that you know, I took off the hearing device because it was still turned on while you were trying whatever you were doing, I just wanted to let you know that it's not listening.

Speaker 0: Thank you, alright, so you could put it back on if you'd like?

Speaker 1: Yeah, thank you your honor.

Speaker 0: Alright, we're back on the record in Docket.

Speaker 2: FD03 1946-F22, Lisa F.

Speaker 0: Flats vs Glenn H. Can you continue with your cross-examination at this point?

Speaker 2: Can I ask the court a question, if you don't mind?

Speaker 1: Given the time of day, and my unique travel time back, OK, should we just continue this in two weeks, normally you do two weeks, right? I don't know, let me just do this, sir, Ms.

Speaker 0: Berger, what is your schedule like? I want to complete this whole case in one day, I'm going to put a whole day. Mr. Hahn, these are summary cases, so this would be the fourth day of trial, so I have to get this concluded, and I want to do it in a way that all you need to get concluded.

Speaker 2: I'm sorry, your honor.

Speaker 0: What's the date?

Speaker 2: I have three dates, yes, both of them, and are June 24th, all day.

Speaker 0: All three of those days?

Speaker 2: Yes. OK.

Speaker 0: Strike, June 20th, someone took it already.

Speaker 2: I can do the 22nd, I have an uncontested date.

Speaker 0: Mr. Hahn, 22nd of June.

Speaker 1: Yes, Ms. Berger, do we still have June 24th?

Speaker 2: Oh my god, I don't remember.

Speaker 1: Can I see one?

Speaker 0: Hold on, and we have to check Ms.

Speaker 3: Flax's doctor's appointments, make sure she's here.

Speaker 2: She has an oncology appointment.

Speaker 0: Mr. Hahn, I believe the 22nd will be the day, and that's going to be a little bit more than two weeks from today.

Speaker 1: Yes, like I said, I just need to line up this expert witness.

Speaker 2: Judge, I have to just wait to see her MRI, and as for stopping the day, I...

Speaker 1: Yes, please, like I said, I'm getting a little bit...

Speaker 0: I understand, so last time you needed help going downstairs.

Speaker 1: Yes, and I just had to take something for the painting.

Speaker 0: Well, we only got another half hour or so, sir, so I think you could probably complete your cross, and then you'll be ready for your defense that day. OK, we can... Ms. Berger may have to redirect, I don't know, but we'll see. If she does, that's fine.

Speaker 2: Yes, the MRI is the day before. OK, the 22nd is fine.

Speaker 0: All right, so Mr. Hahn, just for housekeeping, the 22nd will be the day of trial, all day. Hopefully you can withstand that. If we need it, you might conclude in the morning. I don't know.

Speaker 1: I know, but yeah.

Speaker 0: All right. All right, so Mr.

Speaker 2: Hahn, I don't...

Speaker 0: you were talking about green paint upstairs at the last thing.

Speaker 4: We finished the video.

Speaker 0: Yes.

Speaker 1: So, Ms. Flax, you said that that was the first time that you were in the house, correct?

Speaker 3: I believe so. We did make a couple different versions of the video, I think, so it might have been... I think so.

Speaker 1: What do you mean? the kids made a couple of...

Speaker 3: No, I didn't say that. I said that we... I think we might have done, like, redone the video, like the first one may not have come out as good, so I may have gone back and, like, that night or something and videoed again.

Speaker 1: So I don't understand. You shot video, but you didn't like the way the video turned out, so you shot different videos?

Speaker 3: Well, I didn't like the way it turned out. I think I might have forgotten something or did it choppy. I think I just did the different sections and turned it on and off instead of having the floor of the house.

Speaker 1: Because there might be some additional evidence, some might be on those videos, Your Honor. Ms.

Speaker 2: Berger, can I please request copies of those videos between now and June 22nd?

Speaker 4: Judge, there is no discovery in domestic violence cases. We've already...

Speaker 0: So, Mr. Hahn, no discovery in these types of cases, but you did testify that she shot a couple versions of it. But it's not something you're entitled to, okay? Not something I can... So I'm sustaining the objection.

Speaker 2: Okay. Okay.

Speaker 1: So, Ms. Black, in your prior testimony, you were talking about my relationship with your family. Can you please explain the relationship I had with your brother?

Speaker 2: You always disliked my brother, immensely.

Speaker 1: Can you... I'm sorry, I couldn't hear it, but...

Speaker 3: You've always disliked my brother, immensely.

Speaker 2: Why do you think that was?

Speaker 0: Abstraction, speculation, Judge. Sustained. Okay. What's the relevancy to that, Mr.

Speaker 1: Hahn? Once again, that this is a situation where there's a lot of maliciousness involved in this particular case.

Speaker 0: All right, proceed.

Speaker 1: Okay. When you were...

Speaker 2: When you were in the hospital for the very first time with your cancer, right?

Speaker 1: I took you to the hospital, right? Do you want to talk to the court or tell the court, "Have I saved your life while you were in the hospital?"? Well... And he's not

Speaker 2: being clear as to what

Speaker 4: he, quote unquote, "saved his life.". I don't think he was performing surgery or any of the above.

Speaker 0: I'm just saying, Mr.

Speaker 1: Hahn, what time frame are we talking about? Okay. We were talking about the first time that she was in the hospital.

Speaker 0: What date is that, sir? When was this?

Speaker 1: It was 2017, the end of 2017. So, it's relatively dated all where Ms. Barger has been presenting information.

Speaker 0: So, what's the question? Can you rephrase this question? Yes. What do you mean by saving her life?

Speaker 2: Doctors were in the hospital, right?

Speaker 0: Correct. Go ahead, sir.

Speaker 1: Okay. So, the day before you were supposed to be discharged from the hospital, the first time, you were in immense pain.

Speaker 2: Is that correct? Yes.

Speaker 1: And he filled you up with a whole bunch of painkillers.

Speaker 2: Is that correct? I don't remember.

Speaker 1: You'll remember.

Speaker 2: Okay.

Speaker 1: Um, the reason why I'm bringing it up was because you never... Okay. Um, so, when you were in the hospital and you were lying unconscious, you were falling into septic shock. Is that what he called it?

Speaker 2: Objection, Your Honor.

Speaker 4: How would she know what she's doing when she's...

Speaker 2: I sustained.

Speaker 0: I know there was testimony that she was, I believe, in a coma.

Speaker 2: Yeah, it was.

Speaker 0: So, that's what I was trying to get at, Your Honor. There was some coma testimony. Relevancy to this, sir.

Speaker 2: Okay. The relevancy to this is that I'm just trying to, it seems like, you know, she was saying constantly all these negative, negative things about me, but I was just trying to say that not everything that I'm looking for is...

Speaker 1: I'm looking for a particular piece of paper, Your Honor. Also, how was my relationship with your brother-in-law and your sister?

Speaker 3: At what point in time?

Speaker 0: My last answer? Yeah, so narrow that, please, Mr. Hunt.

Speaker 1: From the point from when you were in the hospital with your cancer going forward. Late 2017 through 2018.

Speaker 2: Sustained, and he's clarified.

Speaker 0: So, 2017 to 2018.

Speaker 2: It was stuff and things that were hidden.

Speaker 0: I'm finished. Let's finish. Go ahead.

Speaker 1: That was, you know, mid 2018. All right, Mr. Hunt.

Speaker 2: I object to that, Your Honor.

Speaker 0: You ask the question, she's answered it.

Speaker 1: Okay. Has anyone in your family ever openly disparaged me to the children from 2018-4? I can hear some.

Speaker 0: Sir, why is that relevant to this domestic violence matter?

Speaker 1: Once again, I'm trying to point out to the court, I'm having a hard time, gentlemen, so maybe if I explain it, maybe...

Speaker 0: And remember, you're going to get a chance during your defense to explain things.

Speaker 2: Right.

Speaker 0: This is the question asking phase.

Speaker 2: So, what I'm saying here, Your Honor, is that there has been a lot of maliciousness, ambitiousness that's been going on.

Speaker 0: No explanation now. This is the questions.

Speaker 2: Please ask your questions.

Speaker 1: Okay. Have I ever hit you? No. Have you ever hit me? No. What?

Speaker 2: No.

Speaker 1: Did you ever hit me with a car?

Speaker 2: Yes.

Speaker 1: So, you didn't hit me then? Did you ever hit me, did you ever stab me with a hacksaw?

Speaker 2: No.

Speaker 1: Did you ever hit me across my knees with a stick?

Speaker 2: No.

Speaker 1: So, you've never been... Besides the car incident, where you hit me with a car, did I require emergency room treatment that night?

Speaker 3: Yes. Concert in the city, and it was just a crazy situation where...

Speaker 1: But you don't remember hitting me with a stick across my knees?

Speaker 2: No.

Speaker 1: You don't remember stabbing me with a hacksaw blade?

Speaker 2: No.

Speaker 1: Would it surprise you that that's in my medical records?

Speaker 0: Objection, Your Honor. Sustained.

Speaker 2: Okay.

Speaker 1: So, besides hitting me with the car, you're saying that you've never hit me with any other physical injuries?

Speaker 0: I think she's already answered that question.

Speaker 1: I just wanted to make sure I heard her.

Speaker 2: You said no, right?

Speaker 0: I was ejected and answered about four times. Yes.

Speaker 1: Sustained the injection. Did you ever slap me in my face?

Speaker 2: Not that I recall.

Speaker 1: Did you ever hit me hard enough that I lost teeth?

Speaker 2: Judge, I'm going to object.

Speaker 4: We have now asked, and he can ask 20 different ways. She's already said she has not hit him.

Speaker 0: That's correct. I only have the accidental hit with the car, Mr. Hahn. She's answered this in many, many ways.

Speaker 2: Okay.

Speaker 1: Have we ever gone to managed therapy?

Speaker 2: Yes.

Speaker 1: And why? From your perspective.

Speaker 2: Because we needed counseling. And why did we need counseling?

Speaker 1: Objection, Your Honor. What is the relevance to this? I sustained Mr.

Speaker 0: Hahn. I don't know where you're going with this question. We're here to deal with what happened in the predicate act. So, and sir, you're going into things that seem to make any sense to me for purposes of this proceeding.

Speaker 1: Can I introduce one topic of defense based on that?

Speaker 0: When you have your chance for defense, you can discuss your case.

Speaker 2: Okay.

Speaker 0: But for purposes of now, you're asking cross-examination questions.

Speaker 1: You related an incident that happened about a family trip that I went over three lanes in the highway when we were last in court?

Speaker 2: Is there a question? Do you remember that?

Speaker 1: Can you, can you, so you said I drove over three lanes, correct?

Speaker 2: Yes.

Speaker 1: And where did this happen?

Speaker 2: I believe we were, actually I think we were in Virginia almost last year at that point.

Speaker 1: So to help remind you, I think we were on 95 in Virginia.

Speaker 0: Is that a question, sir?

Speaker 1: I'm getting to the question. Do you remember how many lanes the highway used?

Speaker 3: No, no, no.

Speaker 1: Would it surprise you if it was only a two-lane highway?

Speaker 2: Yes.

Speaker 1: And what was, so you said that I crossed over three lanes, multiple lanes of highway and pulled over?

Speaker 2: Yes. Were there other cars on the road? Yes.

Speaker 1: And I was successfully able to navigate across three lanes without getting hit?

Speaker 2: Yes.

Speaker 1: And there was moving traffic around us?

Speaker 2: Yes.

Speaker 1: And I did all this without turning my head?

Speaker 2: Your Honor, I'm going to object because I don't understand what the question is. Here's the question.

Speaker 0: I'm trying to sustain, sir, rephrase that.

Speaker 2: I'm going to rephrase that.

Speaker 1: I had a C1, C2 neck fusion, correct?

Speaker 0: Is that a question, Mr. Black? Yes.

Speaker 2: I'm going to object because she's not in, she's not a physician, judge.

Speaker 3: She's a specialized judge.



Speaker 1: Were you aware that I had a C1, C2 neck fusion?

Speaker 2: I was aware that that's what you told me.

Speaker 1: Out of all the years driving, have you ever noticed me to turn my head when I drive? A little bit and that car has, when you turn the turn signal on, has the video thing on the car. So I crossed over the three lanes, going to the left or to the right?

Speaker 2: To the what?

Speaker 1: So I went to the left, but the video that you referred to only shows the right hand lane.

Speaker 4: Objection, Your Honor. Does he have any, is he bringing anything in about this?

Speaker 1: I'm trying to, I'm sorry.

Speaker 4: This would be for, if Mr. Hahn wants to make statements, judge, he can absolutely do that in his defense. But Your Honor has now told him multiple, multiple times. If he's done his cross-examination, that's fine. If he wants to testify, that's perfectly fine.

Speaker 0: I have no objection to that.

Speaker 4: But at this point, he's going to have to have some clarification. Mr. Hahn is...

Speaker 0: I saw mainly objection, Mr. Hahn. Listen, in the scheme of things, she made an allegation that you crossed the lanes, right? You're trying to say, how could I have done that if I couldn't have moved my neck? Is that what you're trying to establish?

Speaker 1: I'm also trying to establish the fact that I never did what she said I did.

Speaker 0: I understand, but that's up to me to decide what's true and what's not, what I think is true. So, you can move on. I understand what you're trying to establish.

Speaker 2: Okay. Okay?

Speaker 1: How are you feeling?

Speaker 0: Objection, Judge.

Speaker 1: What does that have anything to do with right now, sir? Because I just wanted to make sure she looks a little piqued. I just want to see if I should... I wonder if I should just stop, because she didn't... Mr.

Speaker 0: Hahn, Ms. Berger is Ms. Black's attorney. If there was an issue, I would hear him back. Okay. Thank you for your concern, but that's not relevant.

Speaker 2: Go ahead.

Speaker 1: So, with this particular time, I guess my best option would be to do my defense portion.

Speaker 0: Okay, we have 15 minutes. So, you want to start? Yes, I can do one portion. So, procedurally, Ms. Berger has the right to redirect Ms. Black's. Do you choose to do that, Ms.

Speaker 2: Berger? No, no, I'm fine. There's nothing I need to do. Okay. Okay.

Speaker 0: So, Mr. Hahn, at this point, you could start to tell me what is your position with regard to the TRO, in particular, 330-2022. That's the date that the predicate act has been alleged.

Speaker 2: Okay.

Speaker 1: Okay, yes. Okay. So, it was alleged on 330-2022 that I spray-painted the door and the cabinets.

Speaker 0: Okay, so tell me what happened, sir.

Speaker 2: Your version.

Speaker 1: My version is that, unfortunately, I did have some people occupying the house that was moving stuff out for me. I had the cat guy coming in to take care of T.V., Missy Rose and Gary. Like I said to the court, I was actually, at the time, living with my dad while he was recuperating. I hired some people who tried to do some moving and stuff for me, moved things out to a storage locker. They were also doing a lot of digital stuff for me in regards to doing things, getting all my files and paperwork and everything else together. So, unfortunately, people were well aware of some of the stuff that was going on with this particular case. So, the first part was that Miss Flax alleged that I spray-painted the door and the cabinets. We saw the results of that on the video. Okay. I'm here to tell you that that is an impossibility for me that I couldn't do that at all, Your Honor. Okay. And why is that, sir? Because I don't even have the strength in my hands to even open up the lid of this thing. You see my thumb? I can't do this. Do you mind?

Speaker 0: Oh, hold on. What do you want to establish, by the way?

Speaker 1: I'm establishing the fact, Your Honor, that I couldn't have spray-painted because...

Speaker 0: What are you showing the court?

Speaker 2: Oh, I'm sorry. Here's a bottle of spray-paint.

Speaker 1: What color is it? Gray. Same color. That was one of the things. Matter of fact, this is the same cans that were in that cabinet that was in there. So, I saw what they did. They used this pry-on. This is stuff that I used for Rust-Oleum.

Speaker 0: Who did it? Who used the pry-on?

Speaker 1: I think it was one of the people from the moving company, Your Honor, because I gave them a lot of stuff in the house.

Speaker 0: So, that's why I also had the cameras in front of the house, Your Honor.

Speaker 1: So, I'm trying to demonstrate, Your Honor, that it's physically impossible for me to even do what she alleged that I did. And I'm very sorry that it happened to her.

Speaker 0: I truly am.

Speaker 1: And I would be more than happy to pay for any sort of damages whatsoever to make it right. But this is something that physically I was not able to do. So, if Your Honor would allow me to proceed, I can demonstrate not only that I can't lift this thing up, Your Honor, but I don't have the strength to even. Mr.

Speaker 0: Hahn, I understand it takes some strength to open up the paint can. I know that. Yes, but I don't. All right. So, if the paint can was in the cabinet, whether or not it was opened by someone else, the damage to the cabinets and the door and the upstairs was done.

Speaker 2: Right.

Speaker 1: And I'm prepared that I would pay restitution for that, Your Honor. All I'm saying is that it wasn't me who did this. I learned my lesson when you had me apologize to her early on because I made a comment in...

Speaker 0: Sir, I didn't have you do anything. I just pointed out in the record what had happened through the other family wizard statement.

Speaker 1: Yes.

Speaker 0: I didn't make you apologize.

Speaker 1: Well, you kind of said to me about how does this make you feel, and I said I'm truly sorry.

Speaker 0: So, you're sorry about what happened in the home, but what else?

Speaker 2: Okay.

Speaker 1: So, one, I couldn't physically do what she said. Number two is I couldn't even climb the steps to go upstairs. I wasn't at the

house. It's hearsay, so I can't introduce it, but I actually was renting out the upstairs house on Craigslist.

Speaker 2: Who goes, sir?

Speaker 1: A gentleman named Tom.

Speaker 0: Is Tom going to testify?

Speaker 1: No, because I can't find him. I wish I could, Your Honor, because I am extremely upset that I'm caught in this entire situation. Like I said, I'm more than happy to pay any sort of restitution that I need to pay on this. I have no problem with that.

Speaker 2: I never did. Okay?

Speaker 1: My problem is that I wasn't physically able to go upstairs in that house. I was with my dad all this time. In regards to the gray spray paint that's downstairs, I can't physically push the nozzle down on the can to even get the paint to go out of the can.

Speaker 0: What about the green paint?

Speaker 1: So, here's what I think happened with the green paint. The green paint was originally purchased a year ago because you see that table on the table? I remember the table. So, that table is where I built a slack car racetrack for me and Max to play with. So, there was green paint that was left over in the house, but like I said, Your Honor, this was not me who climbed up the steps to do this. Like, you see me. I can't do steps.

Speaker 0: What about the wires that were cut in the garage?

Speaker 1: I did not do that either, Your Honor.

Speaker 0: Who did that?

Speaker 1: I have no idea. As a matter of fact, Your Honor, I don't even know when it happened because, Your Honor, first of all, I didn't even have the ladder in the house. So, there was a ladder that was actually shown on the video. I can't climb ladders, so I don't have a ladder.

Speaker 0: Let me take this one step. When did you move out of that home?

Speaker 2: So, I started moving my stuff in with my dad back in February.

Speaker 1: And then my dad took it ill. So, then I was up with him, but I had people come to the house, moving stuff to the extra storage locker for me. They would give him away stuff. Then I had the cats still remaining at the house. Tibby, Missy Rose, and Gary were living at the house.

Speaker 0: Who? Are those cats?

Speaker 2: Those are the cats, Your Honor.

Speaker 0: My name is Missy Rose.

Speaker 1: And Gary.

Speaker 0: And Gary.

Speaker 2: I know it's a funny name for a cat, Your Honor.

Speaker 0: It's fine, but who's taking care of the cats?

Speaker 1: Right now, they're actually at my dad's house.

Speaker 0: No, at that time.

Speaker 1: Oh, I had a cat guy. A cat sitter that came in every day.

Speaker 0: What's his name?

Speaker 2: Matt.

Speaker 0: Is Matt testifying in this case?

Speaker 1: If you'd like me to, I can tell you. I'm not asking you. This is your case, sir. I didn't know or think that I needed Matt to come in to testify, but I wouldn't happen to call him in and testify to this.

Speaker 0: What about the...

Speaker 1: In-home kitty care.

Speaker 0: No, what about the hole in the backyard?

Speaker 1: So, the hole in the backyard, Your Honor, was a time capsule, just like this, Your Honor. Same thing.

Speaker 0: And why was it outside of the hole?

Speaker 1: It was actually buried.

Speaker 2: It was a time capsule.

Speaker 0: Who on earth did it? Who took the earth and removed it from there?

Speaker 1: Oh, um, that was me when I scraped it around a little bit, but I wasn't able to get it out of the ground. So, I asked a gentleman named George to...

Speaker 0: Is George going to testify?

Speaker 1: No.

Speaker 2: Okay.

Speaker 0: What about the bag on the kitchen table, Mr. Hine? What Ms. Flack said was jewelry and cat feces.

Speaker 1: Okay, so, Your Honor, that particular bag was part of...

Speaker 2: That was my mom's jewelry.

Speaker 1: that was inside the time capsule, Your Honor. If you take a look, or if he has a chance to take a look, we would definitely see that it was the same consistency of the other types of bags.

Speaker 0: Well, how did it wind up? on the table? I put it on the table. Why did you do that, sir?

Speaker 1: Because I forgot about it.

Speaker 0: I put it... If you could silence that, please.

Speaker 1: Yes, please. I don't even know where it is. I put it on the table. When I found out about it, I put it on the table. I meant to clean it off. Unfortunately, the last day that I drove to the house, which was March 15th or 16th, Your Honor, I grabbed the cats, said goodbye to the neighbor, and left.

Speaker 0: That was the last time you were in the home? That was the last time I was in the home. And what about Ms. Flack's having to get a locksmith to change the locks? Wouldn't you have simply given her the key?

Speaker 1: I would have, but everything in the house was internet-based. That's what I was trying to explain to you before, Your Honor. So, because of my disability, it's not like I would get up and open up the door. Everything was on the internet. All the lights were on the internet. Everything was actually controlled through the robot.

Speaker 0: Sir, you saw painting graffiti, and in the bathroom, it said "Scorch Earth".

Speaker 2: Yes.

Speaker 0: What does that term mean to you?

Speaker 3: That's actually the term of my A.I. engine. Oh, I'm sorry.

Speaker 1: I'm sorry. I'm sorry.

Speaker 0: So that's a term that you would know, right, sir?

Speaker 1: Yeah, that was a term for my A.I. And I really apologize because I did not look at it as, like, a terroristic term. So, Your

Honor, just so that you know, the background is, right after 9/11, I was tasked to chair technology for the United States Coast Guard Department of Homeland Security.

Speaker 2: Mr.

Speaker 0: Hahn, I'm sure your background may be important to you, but listen, listen, sir. I'm more concerned about that. "Scorch Earth" was painted in gray, correct?

Speaker 1: No, actually it was black.

Speaker 0: Was it black? Well, we'll have to make a determination about that once we review the evidence again. Yes. Okay. Well, why would somebody on the second floor make fun of Ms. Flack's cancer and her wheat?

Speaker 1: Because I happen to make comments to the people who were cleaning stuff out of the house, and I apologize for that. And who were those people? Those were, like, these moving company guys that I ended up using. People who came in and said, "Hey, what's the...".

Speaker 0: What's the moving company's name?

Speaker 1: So the moving company's name that I used...

Speaker 0: You used more than one?

Speaker 1: Yes, because I had the sector store, so I was, like, hiring people. People who knew the people that came out are people who did things.

Speaker 0: And when was the last time they were in the home?

Speaker 1: Um, the extra storage people were March 25th, I think. Whatever that Sunday was, Ms. Flack, we got an email to you to let you know that the internet was turned off.

Speaker 0: I don't remember what that email is. Okay, so it's some time in the last week of March, potentially, is what you're saying?

Speaker 1: Yes, but I wasn't there at the house, Your Honor. Like I said, Your Honor...

Speaker 0: So, Mr. Hahn, you mean to tell me these people that moved into the home, I mean that were moving your stuff in the home, knew all about Ms. Flack's cancer treatment?

Speaker 1: Yes, Your Honor, and they knew everything that's been going on with this entire case.

Speaker 0: Why would they know that?

Speaker 1: Because I happened to talk about it with people, because I was really frustrated and upset.

Speaker 0: Were you paying these people to move the stuff out?

Speaker 1: No.

Speaker 0: You didn't pay them?

Speaker 2: No.

Speaker 1: They were taking stuff. I gave them a TV set. I gave them some other stuff. I thought they were taking the mattress, I guess, upstairs, but I guess they left it there, so I'm not sure what happened with that.

Speaker 0: So, these people that came into the home, they decided to write that message, graffiti on the cabinet.

Speaker 1: Because I happened to make comments, and I'm deeply apologetic about it.

Speaker 0: Mr. Hahn, I'm going to conclude this part of the testimony, and then we'll go into the prior history, anything else that you want to tell us during the next court date, and then it's going to be up to Ms. Berger to cross-examine you. Okay. So, you intend to call one witness?

Speaker 1: So far, I'm trying to line up a computer forensic person, yes.

Speaker 0: And for purposes of the computer forensic person, do you really think that's a material issue now that you've told us that you've dug that out of the background, out of the backyard?

Speaker 2: Yes, because it has to prove to the fact, Your Honor, that she wasn't able to pull anything from the ground because it was already out of the ground.

Speaker 1: As a matter of fact...

Speaker 0: I think you need to understand the testimony of her...

Speaker 2: I was her brother-in-law, I think.

Speaker 0: Yes. If I recall Mr. Hahn, he found the cover over the hole. The container was already outside of the hole.

Speaker 2: Correct.

Speaker 0: All right. So, Mr. Hahn, let's do this. Ms. Berger, do you have anything before we close out today? No.

Speaker 4: One thing, I just wanted to be clear.

Speaker 2: surgery on July

Speaker 4: 8th for a hernia. It's a laparoscopic surgery because she can't communicate through our family wizard. I just wanted to make sure it was clear. I think Mr. Hahn already knew about it because Max had told him, but I just wanted to be clear that that's what it was, laparoscopic surgery for a hernia.

Speaker 0: All right. Mr. Hahn, do you understand that, about your son?

Speaker 1: Yes, but I have some questions.

Speaker 0: Okay. Well, I addressed the questions to Ms. Berger off record if he needs to contact her about anything in particular regarding Max's condition. Ms. Berger, is that okay? rather than the predominant record?

Speaker 4: He'd actually go on MyChop.

Speaker 2: He has access to MyChop, which actually has his medical records on it.

Speaker 1: Do I need to sign anything for permission or anything for the surgery?

Speaker 0: I don't think so. Ms. Flax is shaking her head. no.

Speaker 2: Okay.

Speaker 0: So, Mr. Hahn, to be clear, you're going to continue with your defense on the next date, and if you feel you need to call that computer expert, that's up to you, and then we're going to proceed to the prior history, and then Ms. Berger gets an opportunity to cross-examine you, and then if there's any rebuttal or anything, but my objective is to give you my opinion at the conclusion of that day, so this case is done.

Speaker 1: Okay. Okay, and I believe we have a case on Friday?

Speaker 0: That's not with me, sir. Ms. Berger could tell you. I don't know what's going on.

Speaker 1: Ms. Berger, is that still correct that we have a case this Friday?

Speaker 2: It's not this Friday.

Speaker 1: Well, understand, it was. Okay.

Speaker 0: So, Mr. Hahn, the TRO remains in full force and effect, no contact, and we'll continue this trial on the 20th, and that will be at 9 a.m.? ? The 22nd. The 22nd, and would that be at 9 a.m.?

Speaker 3: ?

Speaker 1: Yes, all day. This is 830 a.m.? ? All day.

Speaker 0: I would say get here at 830, Mr. Hahn. We'll get you set up to start, and we'll finish it. We're going to finish it. Well, I'd like to get this over with. If we can get it done in the morning, so be it, but my objective is to finish this case, okay?

Speaker 1: One last question. Yes, sir. I never got a change.

Speaker 2: We were going to bring out that bag of stuff.

Speaker 0: I do have it there, and we didn't get to it, so I brought it out.

Speaker 1: Can I take a look at it real quick?

Speaker 0: Ms. Berger, do you have any objection to him? It's dirty, sir, so I don't know if you want gloves, but...

Speaker 2: I'm fine.

Speaker 0: As long as she's...

Speaker 4: I'll just wait because the victim's over there, sir.

Speaker 0: Let's do this. Mr. Hahn, I know you have to move your stuff out. It's almost 25 after 4. Do you want to just do this the next time you come in? I'll save it in the evidence locker. If it's very important to you, I can let you see it now. The only thing I'm concerned about is we need to get somebody to help you.

Speaker 2: That's fine.

Speaker 0: Okay, I'll preserve it. It'll be in the evidence locker again, okay?

Speaker 1: Okay.

Speaker 0: What happens with this stuff? Ms. Berger will tell you. I know what she needs to pack up. All right, thanks, everyone, and I'll see you next time.

Speaker 2: The TRM remains in full force effect. Thank you, sir. Thank you. Do you want that back there? Mr. Hahn, can you...

Speaker 0: Thank you.

Speaker 2: I don't know how that goes. I guess this is the screen. Might have just popped up right now. Yeah.
